Over 65 years, Senior Services of Albany (SSA) has been assisting older adults living in the Capital Region with an array of essential, cost-effective services. Our programs have a direct impact on older individuals' physical and psychological health and can help improve their overall quality of life. We provide: recreational, social, and educational opportunities including classes such as Tai Chi and chair yoga, as well as seminars demonstrating proven strategies for maintaining optimum health, such as our extremely popular, *Aging Mastery Program* (AMP) and *A Healthier You* series. In

addition, we offer programming to help manage chronic disease; one on one case management, care coordination; we provide caregivers with educational opportunities and intensive personalized counseling; two social adult day programs for individuals who would benefit from spending the day in a safe and supportive environment, and transportation services. We also provide nutrition services via our Meals on Wheels Program and multiple community dining centers.

We are dedicated to expanding, enhancing and improving our programs and services to keep up with the changing times and to ensure that the older adults of our communities are safe, provided for, and that someone is looking in on them.

A Year in Review

Community Dining Program:

To be able to sit beside a friend or a peer and enjoy your meal offers so much more then just a meal. Isolation has a wide range of negative effects on both physical and mental health, contributing to a variety of health issues including depression, cardio-vascular disease, decreased memory and cognition, alcoholism, drug abuse, and altered brain function.



A great way to reduce loneliness is to have a meal at your local Senior Center or Community Dining Site. SSA operates eight such sites in Albany County. Our two newest sites are at the Ohav Shalom Apartments - Dinner on Wednesday's; and St. Vincent Apartments - Lunch on Monday/ Wednesday/Thursday. SSA has been working hard to enhance the dining experience at all of our community dining sites and we are excited to be growing in number of attendees and sites annually!



The 3rd Annual Newgate Luau was a Blast!!

The Meals on Wheels Kitchen created an awesome luau-themed menu and provided food for all to enjoy at the Newgate Social Adult Day Program Annual Luau. Rockin' Rob, the DJ, had everyone up and dancing, turning our Adult Day Program into a lively disco. SSA's Elder Abuse Initiative

Now in the final year of your 3-year federal grant from the Office on Violence Against Women, SSA and its grant partners (Equinox, Albany County DSS,



Albany County District Attorney's Office, and City of Albany Police Dept.) have achieved most of our grant goals. A Coordinated Community Response (CCR) Team has been formed to identify gaps in service and encourage collaboration across agencies. Training and education are a major focus of the elder abuse initiative, and on February 5, 2018, more than 50 professionals attended an interactive seminar on Financial Exploitation at SEFCU's Dora Maxwell Auditorium, in Albany. Keynote speakers Liz Loewy, Esq. of EverSafe, Forensic Accountant Karen Webber, CPA, and Sgt. Carman Rotella shared their expertise on ways



to investigate and prosecute elder financial abuse. Community education programs are available for senior groups and civic organizations in

an effort to raise awareness and help people understand how to identify and react to incidents of elder abuse in their work and everyday life.

Trusted Transportation Partner Grant helps our local Seniors

Congratulations to our partner, WestFair

Rides who received an ITN*America* Grant, to access support from Regeneron Pharmaceuticals. ITN*America* awards TTP grants to well-respected transportation nonprofits to support free or discounted rides to medical eye care appointments. This grant will provide older adults and visually impaired community members with free transportation to eye care services! This award also recognizes WestFair Rides as offering the highest quality transportation services for seniors. WestFair Rides is one of 44 nonprofit organizations nationwide to receive this recognition!

This is the second year, that SSA has benefitted from this grant. To date we have provided over **250** rides as part of this program.

The Community Care Team at Work

A story from our Social Worker, Sara!

Mr. B. was referred to Senior Services of Albany through the PASST Program. This program assists older adults being discharged from a hospital, back into the community. Mr. B. had suffered a major fall and broken bones in his arm, causing him to have a difficult time completing daily tasks and staying safe in his home. When Senior Services of Albany's social worker, Sara Riggins, went to Mr. B's home to visit with him, she was able to set him up with home care services, as well as start him on SSA's Meals on Wheels Program. These supports allowed for Mr. B. to remain safely and independently in his own home and kept him from returning back to the hospital.



2018 Intern helps to make a difference!

As a second year Masters of Social Work student at University at Albany, Felicia had the opportunity to personally select her internship at Senior Services of Albany. SSA has hosted students from the University at Albany's School of Social Welfare and School of Public Health for many years; internships which enables them to gain valuable experience of working with the older adult population. Throughout this internship, Felicia has gained a wealth of knowledge by meeting with various stakeholders, attending multiple educational presentations, and working directly with older adults in various congregate sites that Senior Services of Albany operates.

With graduation on the horizon, Felicia wanted to gain even further experience in a different program provided by Senior Services of Albany, and has been hired as a part-time Associate for our Social Adult Day Programs. Not only has this internship been a valuable academic experience for Felicia, it has also helped strengthen her professional skill set. We know that Felicia has a bright future ahead!

Health Insurance Counseling



The Health Insurance Information, Counseling, and Assistance Program (HIICAP) at Senior Services of Albany was in full swing during 2018, servicing over 1,000 older adults. This program assists Albany County Medicare eligible residents to navigate the Medicare maze.

We do this in a variety of ways and tailor our services based on the clients who call us for assistance. For example, a woman who recently moved here from out-of-state was concerned that she would not be able to find prescription coverage for a medication essential to her well-being. With some research, we found a plan that covered the brand name prescription she needed most and had been without under her previous coverage.

2018 Program Outcomes

- 929 older adults enjoyed one or more of the 24,643 community meals with his or her neighbors, and 617 individuals participated in at least one recreational, educational or cultural activity at our various community dining sites across Albany County, including sewing classes, Paint and Sip, Aging Well Programs and more.
- 1,068 older adults received one-on-one Health Insurance Counseling (through HIICAP) and 4,981 benefited from one of our healthcare education programs.
- Our skilled case managers provided 187 clients with 902 hours of one-on-one case assistance; helping them complete forms to access needed services; advocating with and for them with utility companies, insurance carriers and landlords; and securing needed items like bedding, air conditioners, and food.
- 282,482 meals prepared and delivered from our Meals on Wheels kitchen!
- 18 dedicated staff and 220 volunteers helped prepare and deliver meals throughout the year.
- Our professional staff presented at numerous conferences and seminars, and conducted 70 educational programs, both online and in person, which were attended by 1,723 individuals.
- Our professional drivers provided 6,308 rides in 2018; taking people to medical appointments, community meal sites, social adult day programs, and an assortment of personal and recreational locations.
- More than 104 caregivers benefited from our telephone support groups, one-on-one counseling sessions, and educational programs.
- 58 seniors received more than 25,175 hours of care while spending their days with friends in a safe environment at our Social Adult Day Programs.

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
2018 Financial Statement
